## **Foundation Meets Challenge Goal**

The WICF is pleased to announce that it has met the \$500,000 challenge goal offered by the Lilly Endowment Inc.

Dale White, CEO of the Community Foundation states, "It's remarkable that only 15 months ago the Lilly Endowment challenged the Community Foundation to raise \$250,000 in donations to be used for unrestricted purposes. Unrestricted donations are used for competitive grantmaking in our Fountain County communities. If we reached the \$250,000 goal they would match it \$2 for \$1, or in other words, with an additional \$500,000. Not only was the goal met in 15 short months, but it was completed one year earlier than expected."

White goes on the say, "Every donated dollar makes a huge difference and stays right here in Fountain County.



This \$750,000 will allow the Community Foundation to award an additional \$30,000 to \$37,500 per year, in perpetuity, which is vital to our efforts to strengthen Fountain County and fund opportunities which benefit our citizens. We appreciate the generosity of those who care about their county and gave to this campaign."

Lastly, White says, "I welcome the opportunity to visit with Fountain County civic and service clubs, faith-based groups, non-profit organizations and others to share the good work that is being done through the Community Foundation."

# Nonprofit Groups Share in Grants from Community Foundations

Several nonprofit and charitable groups shared in grants from the Attica, Covington and Southeast Fountain Community Foundations, all affiliates of the Western Indiana Community Foundation. Grant monies are made available by donations from caring individuals who want to make a difference by improving the quality of life for others.

The latest recipients are:

Attica School Corporation - \$2,000 for the Help-A-Child program which assists in meeting the on-going needs for Attica children from families hard hit economically – funding provides for school supplies and needed clothing including coats, shoes and other accessories (socks and underwear)

Child-Adult Resource Services - \$8,425 for partial costs associated with the remodeling of client restrooms at the Shawnee Center which provides day-time programming for adults who have a wide range of disabilities

Dear Friend,

Much has changed in our lives the past few months. Self-isolation and social distancing have become new vocabulary words for all of us. Yet, life does, and must go on.

Your Community Foundation is prepared for times like this. Our spending rate for 2020 has already been determined and remains at 5%. Grant and scholarship distributions will remain unchanged, even though fund values are temporarily less. We continue to pay invoices weekly and process charitable contributions daily.

The Board of Directors and staff at the Community Foundation have spent years being wise stewards of the donations that we have received and as a result we do not anticipate the need to adjust day-to-day operational spending. ## "Helping People Improve Our Community"



A charitable gift annuity is an agreement between you and Western Indiana Community Foundation. In exchange for your charitable gift, the Foundation agrees to pay you and/or your loved ones a fixed annuity for life. The size of the payment is determined at the time the gift is made and will not fluctuate with the market. The Foundation issues gift annuities in amounts of \$10,000 and greater.

When you establish a gift annuity, you get to decide what endowment fund (scholarships, parks, senior citizens, children & youth, healthcare, historic preservation, etc.) at WICF the annuity assets will ultimately support. You receive an immediate income tax deduction for a portion of the gift, and this deduction can be used over as many as six consecutive tax years. If your gift is funded with appreciated assets, you can also reduce your capital gains liability.

Charitable gift annuities are not insured by any government agency but are backed by the unrestricted assets of the Community Foundation.

#### A) Example of a two-life gift annuity

Mr. and Mrs. Jones, both age 70, donate \$50,000 in cash to WICF to fund a gift annuity. For the duration of both of their lives, the annuity will provide them with fixed annual payments of \$2,300. Over \$1,900 of this will be treated as tax-free income for the next 25 years, with the rest treated as ordinary income. The Jones' current income tax deduction will be over \$11,000, and the Jones have up to six years to use this deduction.

#### B) Example of a one-life gift annuity

Mrs. Smith, age 80, donates \$25,000 in appreciated stock with a cost basis of \$5,000 to WICF to fund a gift annuity. For the duration of her lifetime, the annuity will provide her with fixed annual payments of \$1,725. The gift will partially bypass \$20,000 in gain and will save Mrs. Smith over \$1,300. Mrs. Smith's current income tax deduction will be over \$11,000 and may save her over \$1,700.

## **New Funds**

The endowment funds listed below have recently been established by local organizations, businesses, and/or caring citizens. Any individual, business, or organization can establish a fund and/or contribute to an existing fund at any time.

Donations made to these endowment funds are invested and a portion of the earnings is used to award grants to community organizations and/or to award scholarships to students for their post-high school education. Donations can be made in a variety of forms including gifts of cash, stock, real estate, life insurance, and charitable bequests.

Endowment funds can be established in honor or memory of loved ones for as little as \$1,000. Payouts ("distributions") from endowment funds begin when the fund has reached \$10,000 in cumulative donations and has been invested for one full calendar year.

Here is a listing of the most recent endowment funds established though the Western Indiana Community Foundation.

### Randall G. Shoaf Scholarship Fund

A gift through the estate of the late Randall (Randy) G. Shoaf has created the Randall G. Shoaf Scholarship Fund to benefit students who graduate from an accredited Fountain County High School and are pursuing a degree through Rose Hulman Institute of Technology.

Randy graduated from Fountain Central High School with the class of 1968 and from Rose Hulman in 1972 with a BS in mechanical engineering. He was a kicker for the Rose Hulman football team and many records he achieved still stand. He was an avid golfer until his failing health prevented him from playing.

He was first employed by Bohn (now Heatcraft) in Danville. In 1982, he was transferred to Columbus, Georgia, and retired as Vice-President of Engineering for Kysor Warren, now part of Heatcraft. He is survived by his sister, Kay Shoaf in Indianapolis, and preceded in death by his parents, Robert and Lucretia Verrill Shoaf.

## Patricia Scherer Leath Education Scholarship Fund

Family members of the late Patricia (Scherer) Leath have created the Patricia Scherer Leath Education Scholarship Fund for the benefit of a worthy student, or students, who graduate from Attica High School.



Pat was raised in Cicero, graduating from Jackson Central High School in 1945 and from Ball State Teachers College in 1949. She later received her Master's Degree in Elementary Education from Columbia University in New York, graduating with honors.

Pat taught Kindergarten for several years in Speedway, Indiana, and retired as an elementary school teacher in Attica after serving for 35 years and teaching over 1,000 children.

She was an active volunteer as a member of Alpha Omega Pi Sorority while at Ball State and served her communities through Job's Daughters; Eastern Star; Rainbow Girls, and Tri-Kappa Sorority - Attica.

Pat is survived by her two daughters, Jennifer Leath and Joanna Williams; she was preceded in death by her husband, John Leath.

The scholarship monies are invested and a portion of the earnings each year will be used to award a scholarship to applicants who are pursuing a degree or career in the teaching profession (Elementary or Secondary Education). This scholarship is a one-time award and not automatically renewable. However, the awardee may re-apply and compete with other applicants in following years. A student may receive the award for a maximum of four years.

## **Grant Guidelines**

#### **Grant Focus**

Western Indiana Community Foundation focuses on local needs within the geographical boundaries of Fountain County with consideration given to the areas of health, charitable service, education, cultural affairs, and community improvement.

All endowment funds, which stipulate in the fund agreement the areas to be supported from the income earned on the fund assets, will be honored regardless of location of the grant recipient.

#### **Grant Review**

The Board of Directors will review each grant request in preparation for its regular board meeting. Grant applications may be submitted at any time throughout the year. Applicants will be notified immediately following the Board of Directors' decision.

#### The Western Indiana Community Foundation is especially interested in learning of plans for:

- · Startup costs for new programs
- · One time projects or needs

· Capital needs beyond an applicant's capabilities

#### The Western Indiana Community Foundation will not consider:

- · Individuals except for scholarships
- Support for regular operating budgets
- · Long-term funding
- · Apparel such as school/sport uniforms
- · Organizations for political or religious purposes
- · Contributions to endowments
- · Post-event situations

With a long-term horizon, the Foundation investment philosophy prioritizes the preservation of the original donor gift. Donations are invested (with the exception of pass-through funds) in order to create an annual stream of income which is distributed to the charitable organizations, scholarship recipients or the purpose as designated by the donor.

A large number of endowed funds that donors created with the Foundation are given as unrestricted grants, which means the Foundation has discretion to grant those annual earnings to meet the community needs in the areas designated by the donor. We call these funds Unrestricted Funds or Community Funds. The Foundation holds more than 30 of these funds (of our total of 305 funds). Earnings of more than \$275,000 are distributed from these 30 funds annually.
